Our mission is to prevent blindness and preserve sight.

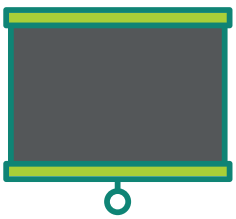
Last year we:



Provided **8,022** individuals with necessary follow-up services they would not have been able to receive without Prevent Blindness Texas.



Certified **733** children and adult vision screeners through the only national certification program of its kind.



In partnership with the eye care and health community, delivered patient education to more than **16,000** adults and children.

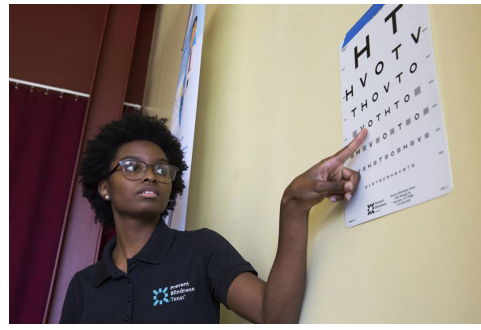


Screened **27,839** children and **8,288** adults.

AMON CARTER FOUNDATION generously awarded PBT with a \$50,000 grant to expand early detection initiatives, including distance/near visual acuity screenings, eye health education and navigation services for eye care services for medically under-served adults in Tarrant County. PBT collaborates with North Texas Area Community Health Center clinics to certify and train staff to provide services that identify risk and connect more 140 clinic clients to resources to access quality eye care. The PBT team has served more than 2,200 individuals in the Fort Worth area in the last year.

The **NAJIM CHARITABLE FOUNDATION** funding allowed PBT to significantly expand our children's programming in the San Antonio area. Their generous support made it possible to reach out and serve more than 13,000 children this past year. This year's funding to PBT will significantly improve access to follow-up care for students identified with a vision issue.

THE UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON COLLEGE OF OPTOMETRY has been key partner for expanding our services in the Greater Houston area. The partnership provides resources for our clients to help them access quality eye care quickly. Their clinic staff and students often volunteer for PBT throughout the year making it possible to reach so many more people. With their support we were able to connect hundreds of clients to follow-up services. We are grateful for their continued partnership.

The team at **GEICO** has been instrumental in supporting the Houston Eye Stroll! Last year, we doubled the number of Walk participants. It is in partnership with incredible sponsors like GEICO that we can grow and have even more impact in the community. They not only sponsor the Walk but come out in full force the day of and always have a big team there! This year, a member of their team is serving on our Walk Committee as well. They are engaged, strategic and committed partners that make a difference for PBT and our clients.
